### How You Can Help:

### #1 Sponsor Local Students

- Reach out to local schools, churches, and student activities.
  - Counselors, Interact Advisors, Teachers, Coaches can all help connect you with students who are interested in leadership.
- Determine your club's selection criteria, how many students you would like to send, and set up interviews with the applicants.
   (Though interviews are not required by the district, having students interview helps them learn interviewing skills.)
- Selected students will be sent an acceptance letter and will be able to register online.
- Parental approval required

#### #2 Be a Team Counselor

- If you enjoy working with teenagers, are a sympathetic/ empathetic listener, are able to provide a non-judgmental environment for a team and have high energy and stamina, this is a great opportunity!
- Counselors must attend a training, complete the online training, and attend a pre-camp online meeting.
- Counselors will work with alumni, who are building their skills further by increasing responsibilities. Each team will have 2-3 leaders who will work together to help students grow in their leadership and life skills.
- Must be available to help lead the team April 18-20 online from 5-9pm (includes staff meeting from 5-6). No special technical skills are required for this. Tech support is provided.
- Must be available to help lead the team April 21-23 at Camp ldyllwild.
